## **College Placement**

With a 100% graduation rate, the Class of 2008 (48 students) was offered over \$2.7 million in scholarships; receiving over \$927,000 in scholarships. Over 95% of these graduates went on to four year colleges at some of the finest universities/colleges in the country.

Our outstanding Athletic program, and our Spring musical productions offer a no-cut policy to incoming freshmen. Our teams have consistent successes in their conference and have won State championships in baseball, basketball, football, track, softball, volleyball and wrestling. Our spring musical continues to play to sell out crowds and is presented in our newly renovated Topper Hall Performing Arts Center.

## **ACT/WKCE Testing**

Catholic Central students' ACT scores consistently exceed the state and national ACT average scores. The composite score for the 2008 graduates taking the ACT was 23.0. Catholic Central sophomores taking the standardized WKCE (Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Exam) had consistent high test scores for each of the last four years.
